### What are the strengths of St Andrew's CE (VA) Infant School?

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• Small community feel. Adults know all the children by name and seem genuinely to care about individual children. Our daughter enjoys after school clubs and the Kids Club at the Junior School is a great addition.

# Have you any suggestions for improvement or ideas which we could use in future planning, or any other comments?

- Attendance certificates should be scrapped small children cannot help being poorly and should not be judged on this. As with all other schools we try very hard to keep our attendance and punctuality at an acceptable level and promote incentives for excellent attendance. Hospital appointments are authorised but if your child is not actually here in school they cannot receive an attendance mark. The report used for Attendance certificates only looks at marks at 100%. We will be looking at matching the Junior school's procedure.
- Parents evening nearer end of school year instead of 2 by February. We offer three appointments throughout the year. With our open door policy staff are willing to respond to any concerns either face to face or with phone calls.
- For a 6/7 year old my daughter seems to get a lot more homework than any other school. We will be reviewing our homework policy.
- An online calendar of all events and term dates would be very useful. To include everything such as, which assembly it is each week, fundraising days etc. All dates are available on our school website via an online calendar, diary dates are sent out at the start of the year and are updated on our Newsletter regularly.
- If the certificates could be for the previous week it would give parents a week's notice for time off work for the assembly rather than a day. Staff select children for certificates to celebrate achievements of the current week; this is why it is a Thursday. These children sit at the Red or Green table at lunchtime with Mrs Swallow and are allowed to play in the Early Years Area. All pupils know that they are rewarded for Good Work or Kindness.
- Make after school classes available to Reception children. School days are initially long for Reception children; they are invited to join in clubs in the summer term.



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
