

Ready for Year 2 - Maths

1	Read and write numbers in numerals up to 100	
2	Partition a two-digit number into tens and ones to demonstrate an understanding of place value.	
3	Add and subtract 1, 2, or 3 to any number up to 50.	
4	Recall the number bonds for 10 and 20.	
5	Count in twos, fives and tens from 0.	
6	Know the value of different coins.	
7	Add multiples of the same coin. by counting in 1s, 2s, 5s, 10s.	
8	Learn doubles to 10 and then 20 (using fingers or counters to start with).	
9	Name some common 2-D and 3-D shapes from a group of shapes or from pictures of the shapes and describe some of their properties (e.g. triangles, rectangles, squares, circles, cuboids, cubes, pyramids and spheres).	
	Can you draw them?	
10	Learn the days of the week, months of the year, your telephone number, address and date of birth.	
11	Recognise odd and even numbers and know why a number is odd or even. (Even numbers can be shared equally/odd numbers cannot)	
12	Spend some pocket money. Work out if you will have enough. Can you buy two items (for 50p/£1)? What will the change be?	

1	Spell your name. (including any middle names and surname)
2	Use pencils and pens throughout the holiday to draw, write and do puzzles.
3	Read every day. It doesn't have to be a book!
4	Recite and write the alphabet in lower case and upper case letters.
5	Spell the names of brothers, sisters, cousins or close family members.
6	Spell the 45 Y1 common exception words, especially the tricky ones. (were, there, said, where) and the first set of Y2 common exception words (wild, climb, mind, kind, find, behind, child, children, because, eye).
