We will celebrate our special saint's day in school with exciting activities planned throughout the day, learning what St Andrew did to become such an important person.




Annual Shoebox Appeal

Midday Supervisor Vacancy - Junior School



<u>Magical Maths</u>

This week's Magical Maths is based on subitising. Subitising is an essential part of developing number sense in children by helping them to relate numbers to actual items or groups of items. It can also help children learn addition and subtraction facts. It helps them recognize and understand representations of number.



All year groups can use the picture cards above.

ALL YEAR GROUPS

Look at these cards. Count how many dots there are. Ask the children what can they see?

Reception

- The children can count the dots and then you can ask them to write the number they can see to practice number formation.
- Discuss which is the biggest and smallest number.
- Can you collect this many items from your toy box?
- Can you see the number in the house or outside on doors?
- Can you clap/ jump/ blink that many times?

Year 1

- Discuss how we could order them smallest to largest and then from largest to smallest.
- How many can we add to each to make 10?
- Draw a number line, place each number on a number line.
- Are the numbers odd or even? How do you know?
- How many can we add to the number to make another amount?
- How many can we take away to make an amount?

Year 2

Year 2 can try the year 1 activities, as well as these listed below:

- What numbers can we add to the cards to make 20? 30?
- Can you write an addition sentence, using the 4 numbers?
- Can you make 4 subtraction sentences?
- What would the value of the cards be if the dot represented 10? 5? 2? Have a try at counting in these steps.
