#### Year 1 Computer Legend – Elon Musk

Elon Musk is a South African-born American entrepreneur and businessman who founded X.com in 1999 (which later became PayPal), SpaceX in 2002 and Tesla Motors in 2003. Musk became a multimillionaire in his late 20s when he sold his startup company, Zip2.

Did you know, Elon Musk sent a Tesla Roadster to space?! He surprised the world by sending his Red Roaster sports car into space on a SpaceX Falcon Heavy Rocket, the car has since travelled more than 377 million kilometres from Earth and is currently closer to Mars! #### Year 2 Computer Legend – Ada Lovelace

Ada Lovelace was one of the most influential mathematicians and English writers of her time. She wrote instructions for the first computer program in the mid-1800s. She also wrote the program for Charles Babbage's mechanical computer, the Analytical Engine.

Did you know, there is also a computer programming language which is named in Ada Lovelace's honour. It was developed in the 1970s by the US Department of Defense.




#### Magical Maths

This week, we have celebrated the Platinum Jubilee in school so for this week's Magical Maths we have some Jubilee themed activities.


#### Missing numbers

The children can count and fill in the missing numbers. They can count forwards and backwards to help their understanding. The children in year 1 and 2 could also count in 2s, 5s and 10s (again both forwards and backwards).



#### Number bonds

All the children need to know their number bonds to 10, fluently. These number relationships are crucial in children developing their number sense and they need to be able to recall these rapidly. The children in Year 1 and 2 could also use these facts to tell you about bonds to 20 and 50. The children in Year 2 can also discuss how these bonds help them find bonds to 100 using multiples of 10 (the numbers in the ten times table).
