Holidays in School Time

Magical Maths

All the children in school are now working towards a Lego target. These targets have been designed to provide clear structure and support to help embed children's fluency, counting and recall. The targets can be found in your child's reading record. For Magical Maths this week, we would like the children to work on these targets at home. When the children have achieved the target at home their parent/carer can tick and date a box on their sticker; the children can only achieve one tick a day on their sticker.

Once the children have achieved this target 5 times at home, they will be 'challenged' in school. When they have achieved that target they will receive a certificate and will then move on to their next target and get to move their Lego figure along the blocks on their classroom display.

The targets that the children are working through are shown below (check your child's reading record to see what they are working on).

All the children in school start their targets working through the same 5 first targets, after they have achieved these they move on to either the Reception/Year 1 targets or the Year 2 targets.

We are really looking forward to working towards these targets with the children and celebrating their success in maths!




