




Key Learning this term – Year 2 – Land Ahoy

RE	English	Maths
<p><u>Who am I and what does it mean to belong?</u></p> <p>In this unit, we will learn about Christianity and Islam. We will learn about ways in which believers put their beliefs into practice, and what the word sacred means.</p> <p>Children will learn that Christianity is a living and diverse faith.</p> <p>By learning about other faiths, children will develop an informed and respectful attitude to religions and non-religious worldviews.</p>	<p>We have so much to learn about pirates in this topic which will give us exciting and purposeful reasons for writing, including:</p> <p>Pirate story writing Wanted posters Diary writing Message in a Bottle - letter writing</p> <p>In grammar, we will be learning about contractions (e.g. don't can't isn't) and possessive apostrophes (e.g. the pirate's ship).</p>	<p>The topic for this half term is money.</p> <p>We will be identifying coins, adding and subtracting money.</p> <p>Then we will move on to multiplication and division.</p> <p>Keep practising your counting in 2s, 5s, 3s, and also counting on in ten from any number.</p>

<p>We will be exploring the survival needs and diet of pirates and people in a new science unit 'Human Survival'.</p> <p>What is the right amount of exercise/sleep/food needed to stay healthy?</p> <p>How do pirates (and children) keep clean?</p> <p>Art - we will be exploring use of shade to create mood and tone to create accurate colours for our self 'pirate' portraits and still life paintings.</p> <p>We will print patterns to create a pirate flag using the collagraph technique learnt in Y1.</p>	<p>We will be discovering difference between past and present and the 'golden age' of the pirate.</p> <p>We will use phrases such as a long time ago, centuries ago when discussing passing of time.</p> <p>We will be comparing aspects of life now and in the past.</p> <p>We will learn about a significant historical figure and their contribution to national or international history. Including James Cook and Grace Darling.</p> <p>Who were the famous explorers who sailed the world discovering new lands?</p> <p>Where did they go and what did they find there and what did it teach us?</p> <p>Did anything stand in their way or make their voyage difficult?</p>	<p>We will name and locate the continents and oceans of the world, including the seas around the UK.</p> <p>We will identify hot and cold areas of the world, in relation to the equator, the north and south poles and look at the characteristics of different countries.</p> <p>We will follow a map and use compass directions.</p>
<p>Can you...</p> <p>Read a pirate story and bring it to school to share.</p> <p>Learn some pirate 'speak' – Ahoy there!</p> <p>Find out about a famous ship and share your findings with the class.</p> <p>Visit your local library to read and borrow story and information books about the sea.</p> <p>Find and learn some pirate jokes. Practise reading them at home to perform in school and make your pirate friends laugh!</p> <p>Look at holiday brochures or travel websites and talk about holiday destinations around the world.</p> <p>Which seas or oceans are close to each destination? Locate them on a world map noting their location in relation to the Equator and the North and South Poles. How does the location affect the weather? What might the weather be like? Where would you most like to go?</p>	<p>Vocabulary for this topic</p>	
	crew	The workers on a pirate ship
	treasure	Precious gold and jewels that a pirate might be buried in a treasure box.
	diet	The food eaten by a person.
	hygiene	Keeping your body clean (hair, teeth, hands, nails, bottoms) is having good hygiene.
	explorer	A person who goes looking for new places.
	equator	An imaginary ring around the middle of the world where it is the hottest.
	pirate	A person who attacks and robs ships. Lots of the famous pirates we know of were alive 200-300 years ago.
	pirate speak	scallywag, landlubber, aye, avast!, land-ho, ahoy.
