#### Uniform

#### <u>Courage – Our Value</u>





#### Magical Maths

This week's Magical Maths tasks are all about money. It would be really good for the children to see and use some real coins to help with the activities this week.

All the children could look at and learn the value of the coins, you could also discuss what they look like, describe them and ask how they feel. For example, are some heavier or lighter than others? They could sort the coins by shape, colour or size. The children could draw round the coins, trace them or even do some wax rubbings. If you have any foreign currency, they could look at the difference in the coins too.

The children in Reception could count one pence coins and make different amounts with them. Children in KS1 could also count in 1ps, 2ps, 5ps and 10ps. They could also use all coins to make different amounts and you could set up a shop game where the items have a price. Can the children select the correct coins to pay? Are they able to give change? If needed, the children could draw a number line to help them with this activity too.


