Children need to know that the position of something means where it is and you use directions and turns to get from one place to another.


When we are describing position or where something is, we use keywords such as:


- top
- middle
- bottom
- below
- above
- in front
- behind
- on
- under




You can ask the children to describe where objects are, how they can move from one place to another and really encourage the use of good positional language. Whilst learning this language, it is also a great time to ensure that the children know left and right and also know the 4 compass points (north, east, south & west).





