### Penalty Notice Increase

From September, there will be some changes being made to the prosecutions for families taking holidays during term time. Taking holidays in term time will affect children's schooling as much as any other absence and we expect parents to support us by not taking children away in school time. In line with government guidance, the Headteacher may not grant any leave of absence for holidays in term time. Holidays taken in term-time will be recorded as 'unauthorised' and the authority will administer fines should holidays be taken. Fines from Calderdale Local Authority will be £80 per parent per child. This fine increases if not paid within 14 days. This includes fines going to stepmother or stepfather who take the child on holiday whether or not they have parental responsibility. The fine will not go to a parent who does not take the child on holiday. For example, if a child lives with mum and stepfather and they go on holiday, they will both receive a fine for the child.

### Every Mind Matters

As we approach the end of the year, the children will be focusing on transition and moving into their new year group, where they will have new targets. It is important that they remember their abilities and believe in themselves as they face new challenges.








## Magical Maths



