As scientists, we will be learning about animals that live in the woodland, thinking about how we can sort and group them based on their features. We will also be identifying and naming a variety of common wild and garden plants, including deciduous and evergreen trees. We will also describe the basic structure of plants and flowers. Whilst we do this learning, we will ask scientific questions and investigate answers together.

In DT, we will be designers who creatively design and make products such as a tree boggart out of clay. We will think about how to select appropriate materials to build a nest for an animal. We also use natural materials as we design and make a woodland crown.

As artists, in our art lessons we will be observing and drawing British flowers, thinking about mixing secondary colours to paint woodland creatures as well as using pattern, texture, colour and shape to create a piece of woodland art. We will also do some outdoor art work as we use more natural materials to create a sculpture inspired by Andy Goldsworthy.

As geographers, we will be going on a walk in the local park and woods, where we will be studying maps, (online and in paper) to view our route. We will also name the streams and rivers in the local area. Following on from this, the children will us the skills they have learned to create their own map of our woodland walk.

After this, to develop their map work further, the children will create imaginary woodland maps, and then create imaginary miniature woodland in school.
